

Pioneers from other clubs and chapters who have occasionally attended our annual fall convention will also be there. And this year, getting to the national assembly will be more convenient for our Carotel and Tar Heel Chapter Pioneers because it will be held right here in North Carolina!

The 32nd national spring assembly will be held on April 26-28th in Dobson, NC at the Hampton Inn in on 150 Charlestowne Drive. Dobson is a stone's throw from Mount Airy, the home of Andy Griffith and the town on which the fictional town of Mayberry was based. The theme for this year's spring assembly....you guessed it...is Mayberry. Everyone is invited (but not required) to come as your favorite Mayberry character on Friday night. CAROTEL PIONEERS REACH OUT TO OTHERS

ON VALENTINES DAY

Again this year, several Pioneers made a special effort to during February to reach out to others as part of a yearlong commit-




ment to encourage others. One Pioneer couple sent more than 40 Valentines Day cards to shut-ins, friends who were sick, and others who they thought needed to know that someone cared. Another Pioneer mailed a dozen Valentines Day cards to old friends who live too far away to visit.



Residents at a skilled care nursing facility were treated to a valentine card with a sweet treat by one of our Pioneers, who enlisted a friend to help her deliver the cards and say hello to each patient. After experiencing the reactions of the folks who received the cards, she said, "128 cards given to the most appreciative residents; something so small means such a lot." One Pioneer couple mailed cards to widows, widowers, and friends in assisted living facilities and they treated two widowed friends to lunch. They also treated a widow to a mountain retreat and took her to dinner at Ruth Chris Steakhouse where they reminisced with laughter and tears about times spent with her deceased husband.

Our "Karaoke Crew" visited a skilled nursing facility to serenade the residents. A few staff members joined in and sang their own tunes to help entertain their patients. The crew also delivered flowers and dessert to a shut-in.




A staff member takes the stage to help the karaoke crew entertain patients.

One Pioneer couple who is regularly involved in a church outreach ministry said. "We have 14 church members who are shut in. Four of them we keep in contact with mostly by card and phone calls. The other ten we visit on a regular basis. We have four teams. We alternate months and two teams visit every other month, but we sometimes over lap if there is a special need or urgency. We usually take food or snacks when we visit. If we know some likes a specific restaurant, we will pick up a take-out order for them, or if they are able, we will take them that restaurant. It's a very enjoyable and rewarding ministry to be involved with."

APPLICATIONS FOR CAROTEL AND TAR HEEL CHAPTER 2024 SCHOLARSHIPS NOW AVAILABLE

College students who are related to a Carotel or Tar Heel Chapter Pioneer are invited to apply for scholarships to be awarded this fall.

Carotel's **"Elizabeth Bland Memorial Scholarship"** was established in memory of Elizbeth "Libba" Bland in recognition of her years of dedication to the Carotel Pioneer club. The scholarship, *a* <u>one-time grant</u> of **\$1,000.00**, is awarded annually to a college-bound student who is related to an active Carotel Pioneer Club member. Carotel members who are pursuing a degree are also eligible.



The Tar Heel Chapter of the ITPA has been awarding scholarships to college-bound students for nearly 25 years. Tar Heel Chapter scholarships are available to family members of active chapter members who are residents of North Carolina. In earlier years, students received awards from separately funded Tar Heel Chapter scholarships, all of which were merged in recent years into the **"Bill and Joe Lawrence Scholarship"** fund. Bill and Joe both worked for Heins Telephone Company. (The family of Isabelle Heins Lawrence, Bill's wife, founded Heins Telephone Company.) Bill and Joe were dedicated Pioneers, and they established a fund that helps the Tar Heel Chapter continue awarding annual scholarships. The scholarship is awarded annually to a college-bound student who is related to an active Tar Heel Chapter Pioneer. Tar Heel Pioneers who are pursuing a degree are also eligible.

The Carotel Club and Tar Heel Chapter award their scholarships independently. Both Pioneer organizations will issue scholarship checks directly to the college or university in which the recipient is enrolled.

The Carotel and Tar Heel Chapter scholarships can each be found at <u>ITPA News</u> (nationalitpa.com). Applicants must complete their application in its entirety and must provide all required information (letters of recommendation, transcripts, etc.) to the scholarship committee chair directly, by e-mail, or by U.S. Mail with a **postmark date** no later than **August 1, 2024.** Incomplete applications will not be considered. The scholarship committee will evaluate all eligible applications and decisions of the committee are final.

SUPER BOWL PARTY RECIPES

The following recipes are just a sampling of the tasty treats that our Pioneers enjoyed together at the Tar Heel Chapter's Super Bowl party in Myrtle Beach. We hope you enjoy these recipes now as much as we did then! WHITE WINE CAKE

Ingredients:

- 1 box Duncan Hines Yellow cake mix
- 1 box instant vanilla pudding (small box)
- 4 large eggs
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3/4 cup cold water
- 3/4 cup oil
- 1/2 cup sweet white wine (I used Moscato)

Directions:

Mix all dry ingredients together in a bowl. Make hole in center of dry ingredients and add eggs, water, oil and wine. Use whisk to blend, then use mixer on medium speed until smooth. Grease pan. DO NOT FLOUR. Bake at 325° for 75 minutes or until cake tester comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes.

While cake is cooling, combine the following ingredients in a sauce plan and bring to a boil. Boil for 2-3 minutes: •1/2 stick margarine •1/8 cup water •1/2 cup sugar

Remove from stove and add 1/8 cup of wine. Stir and pour over cake.

CHICKEN CHILI

These ingredients make half a crock pot. For a full pot, double the ingredients.

Ingredients:


•3 chicken breasts

(you can use chicken tenders)

- •1 can black beans, rinsed and drained
- •1 can whole kernel corn
- •1 can mild Rotel
- •1 Tablespoon chili powder
- •8 ounces block cream cheese

Directions:

Turn crock pot on low setting. Place ingredients in crock pot in order listed above, with cream cheese on top. Cook on low for 6 to 8 hours. Shred chicken when done and stir.



SUPER BOWL PARTY RECIPES (CONT'D)

CHOCOLATE COVERED ROASTED PECANS

Ingredients:

- •1 stick butter
- •2 lbs. pecans
- •1 package chocolate bark
- •Seasoning salt

Directions:

Preheat oven to 300°. Add butter to a large baking sheet. When butter is melted, add pecans and stir to coat pecans in butter and sprinkle with season salt. Cook for 30 to 40 minutes, stirring every 10 minutes and sprinkling with seasoning salt. When pecans have roasted pour in a large bowl. Melt chocolate according to directions on package. Pour chocolate over pecans and stir to coat pecans. Pecans will still be warm. Pour pecans on a cookie sheet covered in parchment paper and spread out. Put cookie sheet in refrigerator for chocolate to firm. Break up chocolate pecans in pieces and store in a covered container.

TACO SOUP

Ingredients:

- •1 to 1 1/2 lbs. ground burger (I use 90/10)
- •1 large onion, sliced
- •2 cans hunts fire roasted tomatoes
- •1 can while yellow corn
- •1 can black beans
- •1 can dk red kidney beans
- •1 pkg dry ranch dressing mix
- •1 pkg taco dry mix

Directions:

In a frying pan, brown burger with salt/pepper to taste. Drain burger and sauté onion in burger drippings. Drain onions.

Turn 5 quart crock pot on high. Pour in tomatoes, corn and beans and then stir in both dry packets to dissolve. Add burger and onions, stir and cover. Cook for 2 hours and then turn to low setting. Cook for another 2 1/2 to 3 hours, checking periodically to see if any liquid needs to be added. (Sometimes I add about 3/4 can of water.) Top as desired with cheese, sour cream, olives, etc. and serve with tortilla chips.

TEENIE WEENIES

Cut up a package of hot dogs into bite size pieces. Place in crock pot and cover with Sweet Baby Ray Sauce. Cook on low 1-2 hrs.
